RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS

1. Check the haircut, uniform and punctuality of your ward in the morning everyday.
2. It is always advisable to write to School about the problems of your ward or for seeking guidance. Your letters will be replied to after discussion with concerned teachers. In case of parents wanting discussion with more than one teacher, a meeting will be arranged with the concerned teachers on Saturdays.
3. Check your ward's Almanac daily. Do sign the remarks, if any, and take necessary action.
4. See that your ward carries books/exercise books according to the Time Table for that day. No extra books are allowed.
5. See that he/she is prepared for the Unit tests. Also see his/her Report Card and Teacher's Remarks in his notebooks and almanac.
6. Encourage your ward to take a balanced interest in studies, co-curricular activities and sports.
7. Restrict daily pocket money to ₹ 10/- to ₹ 20/- per day. Excessive spending should be discouraged.
8. Plan further education for your ward beyond the school in good time so that they may be eligible to compete for the maximum number for institutions of higher education.
9. **Children should not bring crackers, holi colours, etc., to the school.** Bursting of crackers and playing with colours is liable to lead to expulsion of a student from the school.
10. Your ward should be instructed to be careful about his/her personal belongings. There should be a name tag on blazers and sweaters. Expensive articles like **I-phone, I-pads, calculators, mobile phones, cameras, etc., should not be brought to school.** They are also not allowed to wear jewellery in school. **In case of violation of this rule the article will be confiscated.**
11. If your ward is absent from the school he/she must make up all the work missed by him/her immediately after return / joining the school.
12. Your ward will be allowed to leave the school campus during school hours only on serious medical grounds and for no other purpose like attending a function / going out of station/prior medical appointment.
13. All parents who are availing transport facilities are requested to give full information about the routes before the beginning of the new session. In the mid session no changes will be entertained.

FEE RULES

- Fee should be deposited between 1st to 15th of the each month from 9 a.m to 1.30 pm.at the school office/ designated bank
- Late fee of Rs10/- per day will be added from 16th onward in case the parent fails to pay the fee between the scheduled slot.
- Parents have the option to pay the fee Monthly/ Quarterly/ Half yearly/Annually, in advance in school .
- No reduction in fee is made for broken periods in a month.
- A prior notice should be given before withdrawing a student from the school/bus facility otherwise one month fee will be charged, if not intimated on time..
- During vacations school office will remain open for collection of fee.
- No student will be issued School Leaving Certificate until all dues of the school paid in full.

DISCIPLINE

- ❖ Any remark entered in a student's diary or exercise book should be acknowledged by the parents. Failure to do this will not be appreciated.
- ❖ Parent's failure to attend meetings called by the Principal amounts to lack of co-operation and defaults the whole aim of education. In such a situation, the school authorities will have no option but to request the parents to withdraw the child.
- ❖ To ensure discipline among the students, the school has the following system to issue warning card :-
 - (a) Yellow Card - Warning
 - (b) Blue Card - Warning with redemption in Principal's office
 - (c) Red Card - Expulsion from school.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT

Students can avail the School Transport subject to the availability of seats, and the routes. Parents should consult school Transport Manager for necessary details.

BUS RULES

1. All students using the school bus are expected to be on the stop at least five minutes before the arrival time of the bus.
2. The buses will not wait for the late comers.
3. No student should come near the entry door of the bus unless it has made a complete stop.
4. All students must occupy seats immediately after boarding their buses.
5. The drivers are authorized to stop buses at the designated stops only, unless otherwise directed by the bus teacher.
6. When the bus is in motion students must not move around in the bus and no part of their body should be outside the bus.
7. Students will be held responsible for any damage to the bus caused by negligence or vandalism.
8. Unruly behaviour like shrieking and shouting is strictly prohibited. Courteous behaviour is expected all the times.
9. The driver's attention must not be distracted for any reason.
10. The bus teacher and the student bus monitors are responsible for maintaining discipline in the buses.

LIBRARY RULES

The School Library is open to all bonafids students of the school. All classes are provided with at least one library period per week. Students have to observe the following rules :

1. They must maintain absolute silence in the Library.
2. Books reference books are issued for 10 days. If the books are returned late without a valid reason a fine of ` 5/- per day for returning books after the due date.
3. Books marked, disfigured or damaged will have to be replaced or paid for by the borrower.
4. Students are not allowed to bring their personal books or belongings into the library.

SCHOOL RULES

1. **A student must carry this almanac to the school everyday. It must have his/her photograph and identity information complete and signed by parents/guardian.**
2. Students who come to school in their own transport should arrive at school before the bell rings. No student is allowed to come to school in a self driven scooter, motor cycle or car.
3. Students should be neatly dressed. The School uniform is to be worn on every working day. Students who are sloppily dressed or not in uniform will be dealt with severely.
4. (a) Non-Sikh boys should get their haircut at regular intervals. Further, **fashionable haircut is strictly not allowed.**
(b) Sikh boys must use bottle green patka with regular uniform & tracksuit.
5. Girls should plait their hair if it is below the shoulders. Short hair should be neatly cut and pinned.
6. Students are expected to respect the school property and each other's belongings. No student should damage any school furniture, write or draw anything on the walls, furniture or in any way damage things belonging to school or others. Damage done even by accident should be reported at once to the class teacher or to the Principal. Any damage done will be made good by the one who causes it.
7. Students are **strictly not allowed to enter the school with valuable articles like Watches or Cell Phones, I-pods, Transistors, Cameras or any other electronic gadgets etc.** As such the school will not be responsible for the goods lost or damaged.
8. Students are not allowed to wear any jewellery in the school (No chains, rings, bangles, bracelets). Girls may wear only one pair of small earrings or studs only.
9. Students who come to school in the care of servants should never leave before the servant arrives. In case of delay, they should report to the school office. Those who go home alone should be prompt in returning straight home.
10. Students should be polite wherever they go. They should greet their teachers when they meet them. Bullying and use of foul language are punishable offences.

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11. The school reserves the right to suspend or to take strict disciplinary action against a student whose diligence or progress in studies is constantly unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to other students.
12. Parents and guardians cannot visit their wards or teachers in the classrooms without the permission of the Principal.
13. As far as possible, once a child has come to school, he/she should not be asked to come home after half day or leave from any period.
14. Students must not miss or bunk any teaching / games / library / activity period.
15. DPS provides education from Pre-Nursery to Class XII. Therefore it is expected that the juniors be treated with love and affection, while the juniors show respect to their seniors.
16. No student should indulge in any of the following indiscipline practices namely :
 - (a) spitting in or near the school building
 - (b) disfiguring or otherwise damaging any school property
 - (c) smoking
 - (d) any form of gambling
 - (e) rowdyism and rude behaviour
 - (f) use of violence in any form
 - (g) casteism, communalism or practice of untouchability
17. The observance of rules of discipline of the school and good behaviour is an essential condition to a student's continuance in the school. **In case a student violates the school rules or indulges in any form of indiscipline, strict action like expulsion/suspension/ rustication shall be taken against the student.**
18. No shouting or whistling is allowed in or around the school building. Standing outside the class in groups/ running in corridors is strictly prohibited.
19. **Photograph of students must be in school uniform (with school logo) for all purpose.**
20. Parents are requested to send the tiffin along with the child in the morning itself. Later on request to send the tiffin to the students in the **class will not be entertained.**
21. No gift pack or any other material except toffees to be distributed for birthdays. This distribution should be limited to their respective classrooms only.

THE 11 SAFETY RULES AT DPS, UDHAMPUR

Your safety and protection is our first and most important concern.

- No student should put themselves in danger. If you believe that obeying an instruction from a teacher would put you at risk of injury or harm, politely state : "Safety Rule 1" and ignore the instruction. Remember, 'Safety Rule 1' is for your protection. It is unlikely that you will ever need to use it. Abuse of it (using it to get out of doing something you just don't want to do) will probably result in your expulsion from the school.
- Bullying, threatening, teasing, etc. Do them and you will be expelled from the school. You only get one warning.
- If you see anyone being bullied, teased, threatened, etc. at this school or by anyone from this school (whether the person being bullied is you or someone else), you must report the incident IMMEDIATELY to the Principal.
- Students at DPS, Udhampur do NOT call people by nick-names or anything else other than the person's name. What you might think is funny or friendly, someone else might think is cruel, hurtful or offensive.
- Any adult on school grounds that is not known to you as a teacher, staff member or parent, (or who is not wearing a school ID badge) must be reported IMMEDIATELY to reception.
- You do NOT accept lifts to or from school from anyone other than your parents, or someone you know your parents / carers have authorised. Reception should be informed at all times about such authorised transport.
- There is no dangerous play at this school... no pushing, no throwing objects of any kind (unless within supervised sport), no playing pranks like pulling out chairs, tripping, pushing in on lines, shoving, etc.
- No student is permitted to open a closed door without a teacher's permission.
- No student or students should be alone in a room without teacher's supervision.
- Shoes and appropriate footwear are to be worn at all times.
- Potentially dangerous animals (snakes, scorpions, spiders, etc.) are to be reported to reception IMMEDIATELY and NEVER touched by a student.

ABSENCE

1. Parents should forward /submit leave application in advance or on the day of absence to avoid inconvenience.
2. Students who have been sick should bring a medical certificate from their doctor on joining school. A copy of the certificate is to be submitted and signed in the school clinic for follow up.
3. Students, who require medical attention during school hours, may be sent by the teacher to the school clinic with a slip.
4. No one who has been absent on the previous day will be admitted to the class without a letter from the parent addressed to the Principal stating the genuine reasons for the absence.
5. Leave for going out of station should be approved prior to proceeding on leave. In case of emergency, parents need to inform the school over telephone and report to the Principal on return/joining the school. They must not go to the classes directly.
6. A student returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, should produce a doctor's certificate permitting him to do so. Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to class:
 - (a) Chickenpox - Till complete falling of the scabs.
 - (b) Cholera - Till the child is completely well.
 - (c) Measles - Two weeks after the rash disappears.
 - (d) Mumps - Until the swelling has gone about one month.
 - (e) Jaundice - Six weeks after recovery.
7. Repeated absence without leave or **unexplained absence for more than five consecutive days** renders the student liable to have his **name struck off the rolls. Re-admission** may be granted with proper approval of the principal along with **payment of a fresh admission fee.**
8. It is compulsory for all the students to complete 80% of the attendance in the academic session to make them eligible to sit for final examination. The percentage, however, could be relaxed on medical grounds. Students who do not take their first Terminal and second Terminal examinations due to illness or some unforeseen mishap will be dealt with under school norms and direction of the Principal/Management shall be final and binding on him.

ADMISSION

1. Admission is open to all caste, creed and community without distinction provided children are deemed capable of drawing benefits from the kind of education imparted.
2. A pupil who has attended a recognized school must submit a transfer certificate from the school. In the case of students from unrecognized private school or those who have not attended school, official Birth Certificate from such as the Municipal Corporation or Panchayat, in support of the Date of Birth must be submitted. **Affidavits are not accepted as valid documents / as proof of DOB certificate.**
3. All documents submitted at the time of admission, become the property of the school and cannot be returned.
4. In the event of any clerical error regarding date of birth in the report card or certificate issued, it must be brought to the notice of the office immediately for rectification.

WITHDRAWAL

1. One calendar month's notice will have to be given for the withdrawal of the child from the school. However, full installment of fees will be charged.
2. All dues to be cleared and books and other school property and items to be returned before the child is withdrawn and transfer certificate obtained.
3. The Management reserves to itself the right to dismiss any student on disciplinary grounds.
4. Students whose academic performance is not appropriate or poor in spite of the efforts by the school, and/or whenever disciplinary profile is not satisfactory will not be admitted to the senior secondary section of the school after the secondary school examination.

SCHOOL CLINIC

- * Medical check up of students is done and a record is maintained. Parents are informed if the doctor finds that a child needs special medical attention. Thereafter the parents are expected to keep the school doctor informed about the action taken.
- * Parents are requested not to send sick children to school for attending classes or appearing for examinations as the child's health is of prime importance.
- * The Medical History of the student has to be filled up by the parents in the almanac. In case any child is on regular medication the details should be submitted to the class teacher.
- * If a student is allergic to a particular medicine it must be intimated to the class teacher.

- ❑ Remedial classes for weak students after identifying their learning deficiencies.
- ❑ Formation of school cabinet.
- ❑ Special days and important days are celebrated in the school in the form of special assemblies.
- ❑ School has various clubs and house system.
- ❑ Digital classroom that are the need of the hour arise part of school's best practice.
- ❑ Teachers are specially trained to operate digital classroom, computer training for teachers is arranged on regular basis.

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- ❑ School has adopted a slum near the school where students do community service by donating wheat, floor, rice, clothes and toys to the needy people.
- ❑ Swachta Pakhwada and Shramdaan are done after every fortnight in the school.
- ❑ DPS believes in learning by doing hence students are taken out for various visits in order to enhance their practical knowledge as well as to groom them to become great leaders in future.
- ❑ Regular excursion and educational tours so that apart from academics they can be groomed in others spheres of life.
- ❑ A school cannot claim to grow until and unless its students bring laurels on the regular basis. The school on regular basis keeps on sending its students for various inter school and state level competitions where the kids have proved that they are the good learners in academics as well as co-scholastic.
- ❑ India is a land of unity in diversity hence to give the glance of various religions in India our school celebrate every festival irrespective of any caste and creed.
- ❑ School arranges awareness camps for the kids every month so that the children can be upraised about the various awareness related issues in the society.
- ❑ The school also organizes various medical seminars for the teachers as well as students.
- ❑ Being fit and healthy is the need of the hour so after every fortnight school arranges Yoga sessions, meditation sessions, dance sessions for the students as well as the teachers to keep them fit and fine.

- ❑ Value education, life skills, social skills, and best attitude for teachers and peers are taught in the school to the kids.

HOUSE SYSTEM

There are four Houses in the school - RIG VEDA, YAJUR VEDA, SAM VEDA & ATHARVA VEDA. Every student from class Pre Nur. - XII on admission is placed in one of these houses. House System is introduced to encourage greater participation of the students in the school activities in an organised manner. Each House is supervised by a House Incharge assisted by other teachers assigned to the house. To encourage leadership qualities among the students, House appointments are made. Each House has a boy and a girl as House Captain. Depending upon the need, other appointments can be made. EXAM RULES (Ist - XII)

CODE OF CONDUCT

- Students should observe silence at all times during the examination.
- The teacher invigilator reserves the right to expel any students from the room or hall if he/she misbehaves during the examination.
- Unauthorised materials are not allowed.
- Any student who attempts to cheat will be dealt with severely.
- Students sitting for the examination must adhere to the school rules with regards to attire, hairstyle and accessories.

BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE EXAMINATION

1. Remove all books and scraps of papers from the desks and classroom (check under the table-top covers and class notice board). Unauthorised materials are not allowed.
2. Students sitting for the examination must adhere to the school rules with regards to attire, hairstyle and accessories.
3. First paper for each day will begin punctually as School Timings. You are to report to school as usual for flag raising ceremony first.
4. Be seated according to the register numbers (starting with no.1 in first seat in front of the classroom - the seat nearest to the teacher's table). Students sitting for their papers in the multi-purpose hall will follow the seating plan for the hall.
5. All bags and files are to be placed neatly in the front of the classroom or side of the hall.
6. All students are to be in their seats 10 minutes before the commencement of the examination.
7. Students are to check their pockets to ensure that there are no scraps of papers, notes and books in their possession.
8. Electronic gadgets and communication on devices such as hand phones are not allowed. Only non-programmable calculators and approved dictionaries are allowed for certain papers.
9. No extra time will be given to the late comers. Students who report 30 minutes after the paper has started will not be allowed to sit for the paper.
10. There should be absolute silence before the question papers are distributed and during the collection of the papers.
11. Read the instructions carefully immediately upon receiving the question papers.
12. Students are to ensure that they have been given the correct subject papers.

DURING THE EXAMINATION

1. Do not communicate with other students. If there are queries, students are to raise their hands and clarify with the invigilator.
2. Students are not allowed to borrow any stationery from each other.
3. Students are not allowed to go to the toilet unless absolutely necessary.
4. Do not leave any sheet of your answers or diagrams in such a position that another student can read them.
5. Students who are caught cheating or attempting to cheat will be severely dealt with.
6. Students must stop writing immediately when told to do so by the invigilator at the end of the paper.

AFTER THE EXAMINATION

1. At the end of each paper, remain quiet and ensure that all scripts are handed in as instructed by the invigilator.
2. No student is allowed to take any writing paper, used or unused out of the examination room/hall.
3. Ensure that the examination hall/rooms are clean before you leave the examination venue.
4. Students are reminded to leave quietly and do not disturb the other students who might still be sitting for their papers.
5. No one is allowed to leave the examination room/hall before the end of the period allotted for the paper.
6. However, after the last paper of each day, students are to leave the school. Do not "Loiter" around the school or neighbourhood.

ATTENDANCE DURING THE EXAMINATION PERIOD

1. All students are to note that they will need to produce valid medical certificates in the event they fall sick and have to go on medical leave. Report to the following Examination Officers in the HOD Room immediately upon your return to the school with your medical certificate.
2. A student who is absent for any paper without a medical certificate will get zero mark for that paper. Letters of excuse from parents/guardians are not acceptable in the event of illness.
3. Students with valid medical certificates will be scheduled for supplementary papers. However, if a student reports sick again with a medical certificate on the day of the schedule supplementary paper, he will be receive a VR (Valid Reason) for the subjects affected in his result slip.
4. 80% of attendance is mandatory to sit in Annual Exam of school as well as Board Exam.
